Venezuela strengthens education system with full return to on-site classes

Since March 28, more than 8 million primary and secondary school students, as well as 3 million university students, have been carrying out full face-to-face activities in Venezuela, almost two years after the COVID-19 quarantine was decreed. This total return to classrooms is the outcome of concerted actions for the health of teachers and students, who have a key place in the plans to contain the disease.

"We go with joy in this new stage," President Nicolás Maduro affirmed, and announced a set of actions to prevent the spread of the disease among educational communities, to advance in the recovery of schools and to promote the comprehensive education of children and youngsters.

The protection of students and teachers has been a priority since the detection of the first cases of the virus in Venezuelan territory, in March 2020. To protect families, classes were suspended in educational centers and the educational activities were carried out remotely for 17 months. Since last October, after advancing in the vaccination of the adult population and starting it among children and adolescents, the gradual return to classrooms with a mixed format began. Now, when 73% of the student population and 97% of workers in the public education sector have been vaccinated, the green light has been given for a full return to the classrooms.

Educational infrastructure

Along with the total return to classrooms, the Venezuelan government will recover the infrastructure of 1,500 educational centers, which will be added to the 5,100 that were already rehabilitated on the eve of the return to face-toface classes. "That means that they are all suitable for children to be in," Minister for Education Yelitze Santaella said in a television interview.

In addition to serving schools, food is provided to 5,000,000 boys and girls through the School Feeding Program (PAE), an educational policy that seeks food protection for students, and school supplies are distributed to facilitate the studying conditions of the most vulnerable students. nine years ago, to all schools in the country, to stimulate the comprehensive education of children and young people.

The movement promotes the theatrical training of new generations, through the promotion of in schools and communities. At least 200,000 boys and girls are part of this cultural project, which has allowed them to discover great works of universal literature.

An example to the world

In addition to stimulating the training of children and young people, work is being done to improve the working conditions of Venezuelan teachers, who are also suffering the effects of the blockade against the country. In this regard, President Nicolás Maduro recognized the efforts of teachers in the midst of aggression and the pandemic. The commitment, the President reiterated, is to strengthen the educational system and guide it to the real needs of the country: "I will not rest in my task, I will defend quality education, in which culture, theater, sports and poetry shine. That is the way!"

For comprehensive training

In this new stage of education in Venezuela, President Nicolás Maduro ordered the expansion of the César Rengifo Theater Movement, born

Brotherhood ties strengthened with Nicaragua and South Africa

The president of Venezuela, Nicolás Maduro, decorated the outgoing ambassadors of Nicaragua, Yaosca Calderón, and South Africa, Joseph Nkosi, with the Francisco de Miranda Order.

"They have witnessed how, serenely, with great wisdom, our people have waged the battle for democracy and freedom," said the President at the ceremony, which took place in Caracas, attended by the diplomatic corps accredited in Venezuela and the Minister of Foreign Affairs, Félix Plasencia. The President stressed that, despite the illegal sanctions, "Venezuela has been, is and will be the epicenter of the battles for a different world," under the principles of Simón Bolívar, Nelson Mandela and Augusto César Sandino.

Growth links

In the case of Nicaragua, the forthcoming installation of a Mixed Commission with that country was announced, which reaffirms the brotherhood between both peoples. In this regard, Yaosca Calderón stressed that "the gratitude and acknowledgements to the Eternal Commander, Hugo Chávez, grows over time, in the memory and heart of the people."

2021: A turning point for economic recovery

The year 2021 not only represents the beginning of a new cycle of growth for Venezuela. It is the contrast between the pretentions of a fierce blockade that the country has been experiencing for seven years and the results of a model of resistance, sustained by policies of social protection that in 2013 were recognized as an example for the region.

According to the Annual Report and Accounts of the Executive Office, presented to the country in March, the 502 Unilateral Coercive Measures (UCM) against the nation aimed at paralyzing the Venezuelan State, since 22% were against government institutions and 25% aimed at undermine the oil industry, the main generator of wealth for Venezuelans.

Also, of the total amount of UCMs 10% were against the right to health, 7% against the right to food, 5% against public transportation and another 7% against the private sector.

This group of actions "as a whole sought not only the economic financial asphyxiation of the country, but also the total stoppage of government institutions," said Executive Vice President, Delcy Rodríguez, who indicated that the response has been the construction of a new economy, which began to pay off since last year. Thanks to the robust social protection system, which brings together policies to guarantee the fundamental rights of the population, and the promotion of a diversified economy, Venezuela maintains its GINI index stable at 0.39, a value that places it among the least unequal countries. In addition to this achievement, there are other indicators such as the 76% increase in non-traditional exports and the maintenance of single-digit inflation for the last six months. As reiterated by the Executive Vice President: "the year 2021 is the year of the inflexion of the blockade and social recovery." PHOTO: COURTESY



Venezuela works for full self-supply through alliances

In view of the harmful effects of the blockade against Venezuela, which reduced the income of the nation by 99% and restricted food imports, the national Government is promoting strategies to achieve full self-supply and expand export capacity.

"The first challenge from the productive point of view is to be self-supply with national production, and we are achieving it step by step in a sustained and sustainable way," said the President of the Republic, Nicolás Maduro, after participating recently in a fair that gathered goat and sheep producers from 14 federal entities.

The exhibition of the productive potential of this sector, said the President, also points towards another central objective for the country: to become "an exporter of food to the world in the midst of the crisis it is going through."

In the face of the economic siege against Venezuela, the country accelerated the process of overcoming the oil rentier model to establish a diversified and sovereign economy.

"With the sanctions, what we did was to stand up, look for the best advisors in economy, finances, fiscal and productive policies," added President Maduro, who stressed that the path is clear: to strengthen every day the alliances between the State, community organizations, producers and companies.

Stimulating production

In addition to promoting the production of proteins, support is also given to other actors such as rice producers. Together with them, we are working for the gradual substitution of rice imports.

These actions contribute both to the saving of foreign currency and to the development of domestic production, with tariff and regulatory policies, said Executive Vice-President Delcy Rodríguez, who added that work is also being done to expand sugar production.

Venezuelan scientists at the forefront of dental regeneration

In the face of adversity, Venezuelan ingenuity has no limits. This is attested to by a group of experts from the Venezuelan Institute of Scientific Research (IVIC), which reported the first case of regeneration of dental pulp with stem cells from a healthy patient in the world.

This is an achievement of the Cell Therapy Unit (UTC) of the IVIC, the only one of its kind in Venezuela, which contributes to the development of regenerative medicine. Now, it puts the country at the forefront of dental tissue regeneration by reporting the case to the Journal of Endodontics, of the American Association of Endodontists.

According to the Ministry of Science, Technology and Innovation, 70% of the Venezuelan population suffers from some type of tooth decay. Many are detected and healed in time, but another important number ends up in expensive root canal treatments (which leads to removal of the pulp) or total loss of pieces.

With the technology developed in Venezuela, the tooth "comes back to life" and prevents the patient from losing his piece, to which sensitivity returns, offering him a higher quality of life.

Since 2021, the Dental Service of the IVIC was working on this project. "With the application of these protocols (...) we have created a national reference center for dental problems, especially with the endodontic and periodontal approach," Dr. José Francisco Gómez, a member of the UTC, told a press team at the time.

With this therapy, "we can serve a large number of people who would have to assume very high costs when it comes to having a root canal and this type of therapy could reduce those costs," said the scientist.

party with Garófalo, on who was issued a Red Notice from Interpol and requests from 193 countries. Alexandre Pétion, solidarity that transcended borders

Imperialism does not forgive Haiti for having been the first colony to liberate itself and to lend support to emancipatory causes. This Caribbean Antilles is the land of distinguished revolutionaries such as Alexandre Pétion, an exemplary fighter in favour of the freedom of the most oppressed.

He was born on April 2, 1770, and from a young age was committed to the principles of social justice. In the Haitian Revolution he fought alongside leaders Toussaint Louver-ture and Jean-Jacques Dessalines, and was one of the first signatories of his country's Act of Independence.

In addition to a clear conviction for freedom, Pétion had a high esteem for solidarity, and thus, as a ruler, he lent all his support -with weapons, resources and supplies- to Simón Bolívar in the Expedition of Los Cayos, in 1816, in exchange for the abolition of slavery in Venezuela, a commitment assumed by the Liberator.

In addition to Simón Bolívar, many were the independentists who had the unconditional help of Pétion: Pedro Labatut, José Francisco Bermúdez, Gregor MacGregor, Carlos Soublette, among others. The Haitian leader transcended on March 29, 1818. The Liberator thanked him all his life and highlighted Pétion as the "first benefactor of the land whom America will one day proclaim its Liberator." Today, the brotherhood between the Peoples of Petión and Bolívar is armored, since it was in Haiti where the Liberator "finished forging the temper of his revolutionary spirit. Haiti is then a holy land for us," Commander Hugo Chávez exclaimed, proof of a bond of brotherhood that President Nicolás Maduro maintains today. IMAGE: COURTESY
